### **National Standard**

### **PROBLEM**

Undocumented immigration into the US has become a monumental problem.

### **SCENARIO**

Since 1980, the Department of Homeland Security reports that annual illegal immigration into the United States has increased from less than 1,000,000 to more than 11,000,000. Efforts to curtail this flood of unauthorized entry into our country have not been successful, leaving many government officials to suggest an alternative solution: allowing entry into the U.S. to anyone willing to adhere to conditional guidelines.

In order to obtain information on each immigrant for monitoring purposes, a processing center, similar to Ellis Island, would be required.

### **TASK**

The Department of Homeland Security has asked you to write a report outlining the standard immigrant intake procedure of Ellis Island, complete with first hand accounts of typical new immigrant experiences as they were processed through the center. This information will be used to help create a modern day immigrant processing center.
