PROBLEM

Many push-pull factors led to a large immigration boom in the late 1800's.

SCENARIO

Immigrants risked everything to come to America for a new life. They endured long, harsh boat rides, the immigration process at Ellis Island, and many social, economic, and racial obstacles once they entered the USA. Alternately, America offered jobs, land, freedoms, and education for people who would never have those opportunities on their homeland. Additionally, horrible famines, religious persecutions, economic hardships, and dead-end life led people to risk all for the chance.

TASKS

Encourage or discourage a prospective immigrant from Europe to immigrate to the USA. Be sure to include social, cultural, political, and economic reasons.
